Conservation of wildlife is a global priority with the survival of wildlife species largely dependent on the habitats. The wild creatures are nature's gift. But due to deforestation and negligence, there is a threat to wildlife and it requires attention to save the country from losing its green heritage.

Ecotourism as a component of the green economy is one of the fastest growing segments of the tourism industry and focuses on environmental conservation, socioeconomic development and capitalist development. The objective of ecotourism is to identify and quantify impacts of ecotourism on environmental conservation, social and cultural heritage preservation, economic development and enhancement of livelihoods. Ecotourism is entirely a new approach in tourism. Ecotourism is a preserving travel to natural areas to explore the cultural and natural history of the environment, taking care not to disturb the integrity of the ecosystem, while creating economic opportunities that make conservation and protection of natural resources advantageous to the local people.

Significance of Wildlife conservation and Ecotourism

Wildlife conservation

- Wildlife resources provide both economic and aesthetic values
- Lead symbiotic life with other living organisms of the environment
- Provide necessary germplasm for developing new strains of the organisms for evolutionary purpose

Ecotourism

- Provides financial benefits and empowerment for local people
- Conservation of biological diversity and cultural diversity through ecosystem protection
- Promotion of sustainable use of biodiversity by providing jobs to local populations
